Sunday School Lesson Plan – Sunday, October 5, 2025

Here's a Sunday School Lesson Plan for young children (ages 4–8) using the Revised Common Lectionary readings for October 5, 2025 – Seventeenth Sunday After Pentecost, Proper 27 (Year C):

Theme:

"Even a Little Faith is Enough"

Bible Readings Summary:

- Lamentations 1:1–6; 3:19–26 The people are very sad, but they remember that God's love never ends and they can still hope in Him.
- Psalm 137 God's people were far from home and missed their city.
- 2 Timothy 1:1–14 Paul tells Timothy to be strong, hold onto his faith, and remember the gift of God.
- Luke 17:5–10 Jesus says even faith as small as a mustard seed can do great things.

Main Idea for Children:

Even if our faith feels very small, it is powerful because we trust in a big and loving God.

Lesson Plan

1. Welcome & Prayer (5 minutes)

- Gather children in a circle.
- Prayer:

"Dear God, thank you for bringing us together today. Help us to understand that even a little bit of faith can do big things with your help. Amen."

2. Bible Story Time (10–12 minutes)

Focus Story: Luke 17:5–10

Tell the story simply:

- The disciples asked Jesus to give them more faith.
- Jesus said: "Even if your faith is as tiny as a mustard seed, you can do amazing things."
- A mustard seed is one of the smallest seeds, but it grows into a big tree.
- Jesus wants us to trust Him, even if we feel small.

Questions:

- What did the disciples want Jesus to give them?
- How big is a mustard seed?
- Do we need a lot of faith, or just a little?

3. Object Lesson (5–7 minutes)

"The Mustard Seed Jar"

- Show the children a jar with tiny mustard seeds (or another small seed).
- Say: "This is very small, but look how big the plant can grow. Our faith may feel small sometimes, but God makes it grow!"

4. Craft Activity (10–15 minutes)

Craft: "Faith as Small as a Seed"

- Materials: Construction paper, glue sticks, crayons, and real seeds (mustard seeds if possible, or any tiny seeds).
- Children draw a tree or flower.
- Glue a small seed at the bottom to show how something little grows big.
- Write: "My faith can grow with God."

5. Snack Idea (10 minutes)

"Seed Snack Mix"

• Serve a small snack mix that includes seeds (like sunflower seeds or pumpkin seeds) along with raisins or small crackers.

• As they eat, say:

"These seeds remind us that even something very small can grow big with God's help. Just like these little pieces make a tasty snack, small acts of faith can do big things for God!"

(Alternative for allergies: use small cereal pieces like Cheerios instead of seeds.)

6. Game (10 minutes)

"Mustard Seed Relay"

- Materials: two spoons, two bowls, and something tiny to carry (mustard seeds if available, or dried beans, lentils, or even marbles).
- Divide the kids into two teams.
- Each child must carry one "seed" on a spoon across the room and put it into a bowl.
- Then they hand off the spoon to the next player.
- First team to get all their "seeds" in the bowl wins.

Lesson tie-in:

Say: "Carrying one little seed doesn't seem like much, but when we all work together and trust God, little things become big!"

7. Psalm Connection (5 minutes)

Read Lamentations 3:22–23 (child-friendly translation):

"The Lord's love never ends; His mercies never stop. They are new every morning."

Teach children to say together with motions:

- "God's love never ends" (make a big circle with arms).
- "God's love is new every morning" (stretch up like waking up).

8. Closing Prayer & Song (5 minutes)

Prayer:

"Thank you, God, that even when we feel small, you make our faith strong. Help us to trust you every day. Amen."


Song: "Jesus Loves Me" or "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands."

9. Take-home idea:

Give each child a small envelope with a few seeds inside and the verse: "Faith as small as a mustard seed can move mountains." (Luke 17:6)
